Tuition, Drop-in Rates, and Late Payments

- Tuition payments are auto-charged for each month <u>1 WEEK BEFORE</u> that month begins. For example, your October payment will be taken out of your account on September 24th. There will be no proration of tuition for any days a child participant cannot attend. September tuition is an exception and will be deducted on Tuesday, September 3rd and reflect previously paid deposits, if applicable.
- At any point in the school year that you no longer wish to be enrolled at Hazelwood, please give us 30 days' notice, or you will be responsible for paying for the following month's tuition payment.
- Drop-in Afternoons are \$30/per day. These will be billed separately at the end of each month.
- After-Hours care is \$20/day

All payments are made through our ProCare system. A late fee of \$50 a day will be applied to any payments that were not able to be processed due to insufficient funds unless a prior warning and payment arrangement with the office was made and agreed upon.

School Breaks & Camps

When deciding on the monthly tuition rates, we have gone ahead and deducted the cost of the weeks of February 20-23 and April 8-12 since school will be closed for the Mid-Winter and Spring breaks. However, we will instead be offering optional camps which families may choose to opt back in for. Enrollment for these camps will open in the new year.

If there is space: friends, older siblings, and school alumni up to 7 years of age may also enroll in any camp we offer. Summer Camp enrollment will begin early Spring. Prices for these camps have not yet been decided.

Forms and Immunizations

All forms will be sent via ProCare. Before school begins, you will have needed to complete the contract, medication forms (if needed), immunization forms, and provide proof of covid-vaccination. You are responsible for updating the immunization forms each year. We cannot accept children who are not vaccinated unless we receive an official note from a medical office showing that child to be medically exempt. At this time, we do not enroll children who are not vaccinated due to personal preference or religious reasons.

Instructions: To see which vaccines are required for child care, find your child's age and look at that row going across to find the vaccines and doses needed. Children must meet minimum vaccine intervals and ages to meet the requirements. Please talk to your health care provider or child care provider if you have questions.

What To Bring

Please label <u>ALL</u> items with their names. We would like to encourage independence, so shoes and other clothing items that your child can put on and off on their own is strongly recommended. Please do not bring them in laced shoes unless they can tie their own shoes.

First Day or at the Meet & Greet Sept. 7th.

- 1. Extra set of clothes to be kept at the school in a sealed Ziplock bag or tied grocery bag. The bag should include a pair of pants, underwear, shirt, and socks.
- 2. (If Needed) Any medications listed on the medical release form along with the required forms.

^{**}Vaccine doses may be acceptable with fewer than listed depending on when they were given.

- 3. (If your child will be napping) A small blanket and optional pillow/comfort item to remain at school
- 4. Emergency kit (in a clear gallon Ziplock bag with child's name):
 - a. 2/3 food items that expire after June 2023 such as granola bars or fruit pouches.
 - b. (Optional) Note from home/family photo for comfort.
- 5. Indoor shoes or hard-sole slippers with a back. (Crocs are a perfect option.)
 These will remain at school for the year. These should not slip off when children move and dance.
- 6. (If Diapering) A packet of diapers/pull-ups and 2 packets of wipes.
- 7. Rain gear and rain boots to remain at school for outdoor R.O.O.T.S. days.

Each Day

- 1. A lunch in a lunchbox or closed bag. Please do not pack breakable containers or containers that are hard for children to open on their own, soda, and gum.
- 2. A water bottle is recommended but optional since we will have water available at all times.
- 3. We will be outside a lot, so please equip your child with the proper attire for any weather.
- 4. Outdoor shoes should be good for running and play. Please no soft-soled, open toed, or flipflop shoes which create a hazard on the playground and woods.

Lunch & Snacks

Please pack a lunch every day. Lunch bags/boxes, food containers, and wrappers should be able to be easily opened by the child. Families need to also supply eating utensils if needed. Water bottles may be brought from home, but it is not required, and water is always offered by the lead teachers throughout the day and at each meal time. Parents should avoid packing sodas, candy, glass containers, and foods that must be kept frozen or heated before eating.

Hazelwood Preschool will be providing a morning and afternoon snack. This snack will include a fruit/vegetable, carb item such as crackers, and protein item such as sliced turkey or cheese.

Please make sure to notify us of any food allergies and note that we are not a nut free school. The full allergy and food policies are listed in our Policy Handbook.

Covid-19 Precautions & Policy

Hazelwood takes Covid-19 very seriously. All teachers, staff, substitutes, guest teachers, and volunteers will be expected to be up to date with their covid vaccine and boosters as directed and recommended by the CDC. We will not be policing families, but I hope each family agrees to be mindful of the spreading of the virus when planning family outings. If you do travel or gather in large groups, we ask that you take an at home test before returning to school. In the event that a teacher or classmate contracts the virus, families will be notified. Temporary school closure could happen in the event the virus begins to spread amongst students or teachers. If anyone in your household becomes exposed to the virus, or shows significant symptoms, please take the proper steps to ensure your child's health before coming to the school as outlined by the CDC. Children will not be allowed to attend if they show notable symptoms such as a fever. They will need to remain home to quarantine for the recommended number of days stated by the CDC at the date of contraction.

Illness Policy

If a child has any of the following symptoms, they should stay home from school or will be sent home from school if observed by a teacher:

- The illness or condition prevents the child from participating in normal activities
- The illness or condition requires more care and attention than the early learning provider can give
- The required amount of care for the ill child compromises or places at risk the health and safety of other children in care
- A child's illness or condition is a high health risk to other children or staff.

- A fever 101 degrees by any method, and behavior change or other signs and symptoms of illness (including sore throat, earache, headache, rash, vomiting, diarrhea)
- Vomiting two or more times in the previous twenty-four hours
- Diarrhea where stool frequency exceeds two stools above normal per twentyfour hours for that child or whose stool contains more than a drop of blood or mucus
- A rash not associated with heat, diapering, or an allergic reaction
- Open sores or wounds discharging bodily fluids that cannot be adequately covered with a waterproof dressing or mouth sores with drooling
- Lice, ringworm, or scabies. Individuals with head lice, ringworm, or scabies must be excluded from the childcare premises beginning from the end of the day the head lice, ringworm, or scabies was discovered. The child can return after receiving treatment
- A child who appears severely ill, which may include lethargy, persistent crying, difficulty breathing, or a significant change in behavior or activity level indicative of illness


To return to school, the child must meet one of the following requirements:

- Be symptom free for 24 hours
- Have a doctor's note stating they are not contagious and fine to return to school
 - Have begun an antibiotic treatment



Signing In & Out

Whomever is dropping off and picking up must have the ProCare app downloaded and ready. One option to sign in is based off of the GPS locator that is activated when you are near the school. Simply open your app, find the QR code scan button, and if you are in range, tap the SIGN IN-OUT button to skip the QR scan and you are all set! Take a look at these images- your steps are indicated in the yellow squares:







If the app does not pick up your location, there is a QR code by the classroom doors that you can scan and sign your child in that way, or just enter your pin. Do not hesitate to ask a staff member if you need help navigating this process or help finding your pin number. You will follow the same steps to sign out as well.
